

## **EXPEDITION LEADERSHIP**

## LANDINGS

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## **PENGUIN COLONIES**

At Neko Harbor, watch Gentoo penguins tending their nests and calling raucously towards the sky after a comical commute from the sea. As you sit contemplating the scene, a curious penguin gathers its nerves to peck around your feet. Spending time with penguins leaves you elated, energized, and laughing.



## WHALE WATCHING

As you cruise through the Gerlache Strait, the early morning light is punctuated with countless blows that catch the sun. A quick word from the Expedition Guide, and moments later you are in a tender as a pod of Humpback whales lunge feed nearby.



## **ICEBERGS**

Infinite in combinations of color, size, shape and texture, the ice is captivating and mysterious. Sculpted blue icebergs glide past, the bow nudges gently through pack ice floes, and tabular icebergs—some miles long—tower above as you gaze in awe at these cliffs of ice.



## **TENDER CRUISES**

Zodiac tenders allow you to explore along rocky coasts or deep into ice-strewn waters. Passing below a wavesculpted arch, your guide shares his favorite hidden cove as the boat provides the perfect platform to view penguins along the shore.

## KAYAKING

Dipping your paddles into the clear, crisp water, you feel a profound appreciation for the scale and stillness of the Antarctic wilderness. Penguins surround your kayak as you pause to watch a seal sleeping on the ice.



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

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

# HELICOPTERS

Soar high above your yacht to gain a better perspective of the vast scale of Antarctica. Nowhere is a helicopter flight as scenic as here as you fly between mountains and over vast fields of ice.

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## MOUNTAINEERING

Climb spectacular peaks, right from sea level and watch whales from a mountain top. With expert knowledge of the conditions here and specialist equipment, our mountain guides can safely manage mountaineering expeditions to suit any experience level.



## **SCUBA DIVING**

Come face to face with Leopard Seals, see penguins fly underwater, or spot discarded bones littering the seabed of a former whaling harbor. Our dive guides have completed hundreds of polar dives and know the best dive sites that most never see. One of our dive masters—inspired by his father, who worked with Jacques-Yves Cousteau on the famed ship Calypso—pioneered recreational diving in the Antarctic. Another managed the scientific diving program at Rothera Research Station, a British Antarctic Survey base.

## **SUBMERSIBLES**


Be among the very few to have ever descended into Antarctica's icy depths, exploring—potentially, on every dive—locations unseen by anyone before.

For decades our team has managed hundreds of submersible dives, including the first dive to 1000m in the Antarctic, dives to the Titanic, and scientific surveys on deep ocean hydrothermal vents. It has also assisted the only two manned dives to the bottom of the Marianas Trench.









## **ANTARCTIC PENINSULA**

Sailing from South America, spend up to two weeks exploring the spectacular coastline of the Antarctic Peninsula. From the wildlife-rich South Shetland Islands, cruise the Weddell Sea where you will see tabular icebergs that stretch for miles, and sail into the volcanic caldera of Deception Island. Explore the fjords, islands and channels of the Danco Coast with its towering peaks rising from the sea and frozen landscapes, visiting legendry sites such as Paradise Bay and the Lemaire Channel. Land at penguin colonies, cruise in tenders among whales, hike spectacular peaks, kayak the calm fjords, and visit research stations to learn from scientists who work here. Venturing south into the ice, you may reach the Antarctic Circle, where the sun never sets at the peak of the austral summer.



## OPTION: FLY THE DRAKE

EYOS pioneered the option to fly to and from the Antarctic, avoiding the notorious Drake Passage entirely. This saves both a potentially rough ocean crossing and significant transit time, making it the ideal option for those wishing to maximize their time in the Antarctic.

With a decade of successful fly-in expeditions behind us, we understand the complicated logistics that Antarctic travel entails and the unique challenges of embarking a yacht in such a remote location. 
South of the Circle, the sun doesn't set in the summer. Delicate pastels of pink and blue stretch throughout the evening hours.

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# SOUTH GEORGIA

Ask almost any of our Expedition Staff their favorite destinations and chances are they mention South Georgia. Isolated in the South Atlantic, it offers unsurpassed quantities of wildlife and tangible connections to the epic Shackleton expedition. Start in the Falkland Islands before venturing across the open sea to reach Grytviken, where you offer a toast at

Spend up to a week exploring South Georgia, widely considered one of the top ten wildlife experiences in the world. Walk amidst over 200,000 pairs of King Penguins on Salisbury Plain, or share Gold Harbor with thousands of four ton Elephant seals. Get up close to the nests of Wandering Albatross, whose wingspans reach 3 meters, or climb through the tussock grass for panoramic views. For those seeking a technical climb, follow Shackleton's footsteps on his heroic multi-day trek across the island. Afterwards, retrace the greatest small boat voyage undertaken as you sail to Antarctica and Elephant Island, where Shackleton's men



## THE ROSS SEA

Nowhere is more remote, challenging or rewarding than the Ross Sea for a visiting yacht. Nearly 2,000 nautical miles south of New Zealand, the otherwise icebound Ross Sea is accessible for only a short period each summer. Only the most sturdy, well-equipped vessels can venture here to the most southern sea in the world. For those that do, Heroic Era exploration history, vast icescapes, emperor penguins, and a chance at a world record await. Here, man's first buildings on the entire continent still stand. The expedition huts of the Heroic Era explorers—Scott and Shackleton among them—remain virtually untouched over 100 years later. Stepping inside is to step back in time, the clothes and provisions a poignant reminder of the sacrifices these men made on their guest for the South Pole. Along the coast, land at Emperor penguin colonies, visit McMurdo Research Station, or fly into the legendary Dry Valleys. Sail along the Ross Ice shelf to the Bay of Whales, where retreating ice may allow

you to reach further south than any vessel in history.



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#### THE SOUTH POLE

For those wanting to experience Antarctica's interior, EYOS can arrange to extend your journey all the way to the South Pole. Utilizing specialized aircraft and field camps, it is possible to fly to otherwise inaccessible parts of the continent, including the pole itself. Here, stand in the footsteps of the great explorers and visit the scientists at the US Amundsen-Scott research station. While staying in comfortable camps on the continent, you can explore ice caves and mountains, traverse the polar desert in special vehicles and fly to emperor penguin colonies on the coast.
